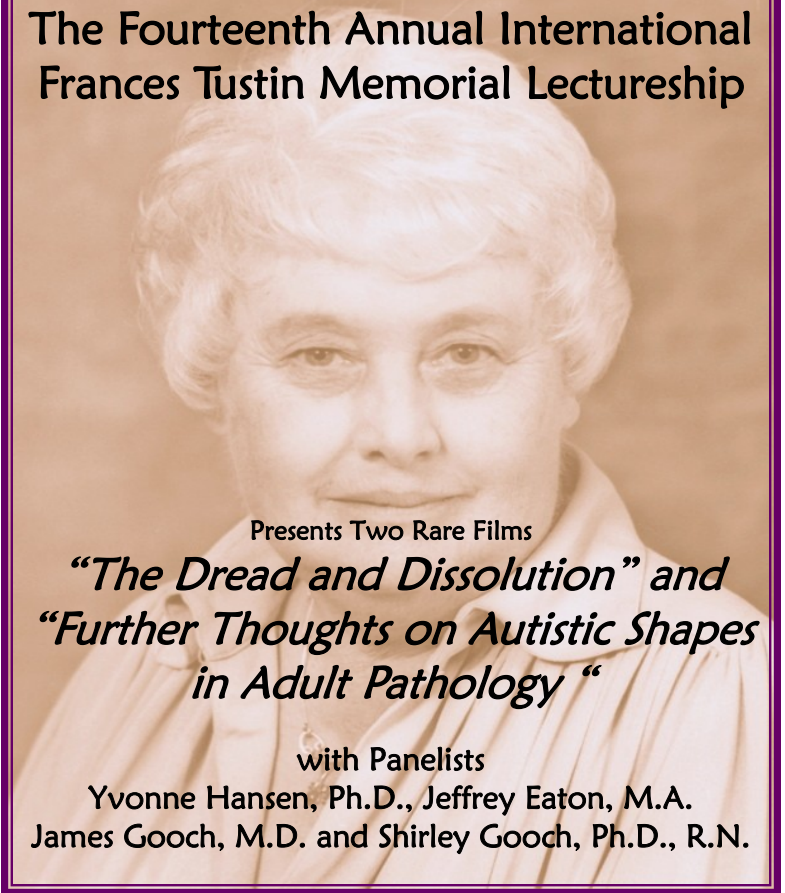

PRESENTATION

This event will feature a screening of two rare films: Frances Tustin herself presenting her papers “The Dread of Dissolution” and “Further Thoughts on Autistic Shapes in Adult Pathology.”

These two extraordinary presentations were videotaped in Mrs. Tustin’s home in Amersham, England. She generously wrote these two contributions especially for PCC’s very first conference “Transformations,” which was held at Cal Arts in 1985. However, due to illness, she was unable to make the long journey to Los Angeles for the conference as planned. Thanks to PCC/Trust Member Dr. Jeanette Gadt, the videotaping of Mrs. Tustin’s presentations was arranged and these films were screened at the conference.

Mrs. Tustin entrusted these films to Dr. Judith Mitrani just before her death in 1994 and they have been screened for small group seminars in many cities for the benefit of the Trust. However, these films have not been viewed by a larger audience here in Los Angeles since 1985. The films are approximately 45 minutes each in length and will be followed by comments and discussion with the audience by a panel of FTM Trust members: Dr. Yvonne Hansen, Mr. Jeff Eaton (from Seattle), and Drs. Jim & Shirley Gooch.

Since 1995, **The Frances Tustin Memorial Trust** has been dedicated to the teaching, expansion and extension of Tustin’s seminal work in this most critical area of primitive mental states. Toward this goal, each year the Trust sponsors The International Frances Tustin Prize and a Lectureship and bestows a cash award of \$1,000 to the author of an outstanding clinical paper on the psychoanalytic treatment of autistic spectrum disorders and autistic states in children or adults. Additionally, since 2004, The Trust has sponsored 3-Day International Conferences on the work of Frances Tustin in London, England; Caen, France; Venice, Italy; Tel-Aviv, Israel & Berlin Germany. **Our next International Conference will take place in Sydney, Australia in July of 2012.**

Yvonne Hansen, Ph.D. Yvonne Hansen, PhD is a founding member and the current Chair of the Infant Observation Committee of the Psychoanalytic Center of California, where she is also a Training and Supervising Analyst in both adult and child training programs. Dr. Hansen is also a Supervising Analyst at the Psychoanalytic Institute of Northern California, clinical instructor at the USC School of Medicine, and supervisor at Reiss-Davis Child Study Center and Wright Institute. She is in private practice in psychoanalysis in Santa Monica.

Jeffrey Eaton, M.A. is a graduate of the Northwestern Psychoanalytic Society and a Fellow of the International Psycho-analytic Association. He is in private practice in Seattle, Washington providing psychoanalysis and psychotherapy to children and adults. A co-founder of The Alliance Community Psychotherapy Clinic, he has served as Chair of the Steering Committee and on the board of the NW Alliance for Psychoanalytic Study. Mr. Eaton was awarded the 10th International Frances Tustin Memorial Prize for his paper "The Permanent Earthquake: Notes on the Treatment of a Young Boy" forthcoming in Frances Tustin Today to be published in the New Library of Psychoanalysis. He is also the author of numerous other published papers and book chapters, and is a Founding Member of INSPIRA (The International Seminar on Psycho-analytic Intervention and Research into Autism). James Gooch, M.D., Ph.D., is a Training and Supervising Analyst at PCC and at NCP; past Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at USC and retired Chief Psychoanalyst at Reiss-Davis Child Study Center/Vista del Mar. He was the founding President of PCC, and served on the PCC Board as President and Director for several other terms. He was a founding member of what is now CIPS and has also served as a Representative to the IPA. He maintains a private practice in adult, adolescent, and child psychoanalysis in Beverly Hills.

Shirley Gooch, Ph.D., R.N., has served for many years as the former Dean and Chair of ICAC at the Psychoanalytic Center of California, where she is a Training and Supervising Analyst in both the Adult and Child Training Programs. Alongside her work with children, families, and adults, Dr. Gooch is a senior Infant Observation Instructor and is currently in private practice in Beverly Hills, CA.
